

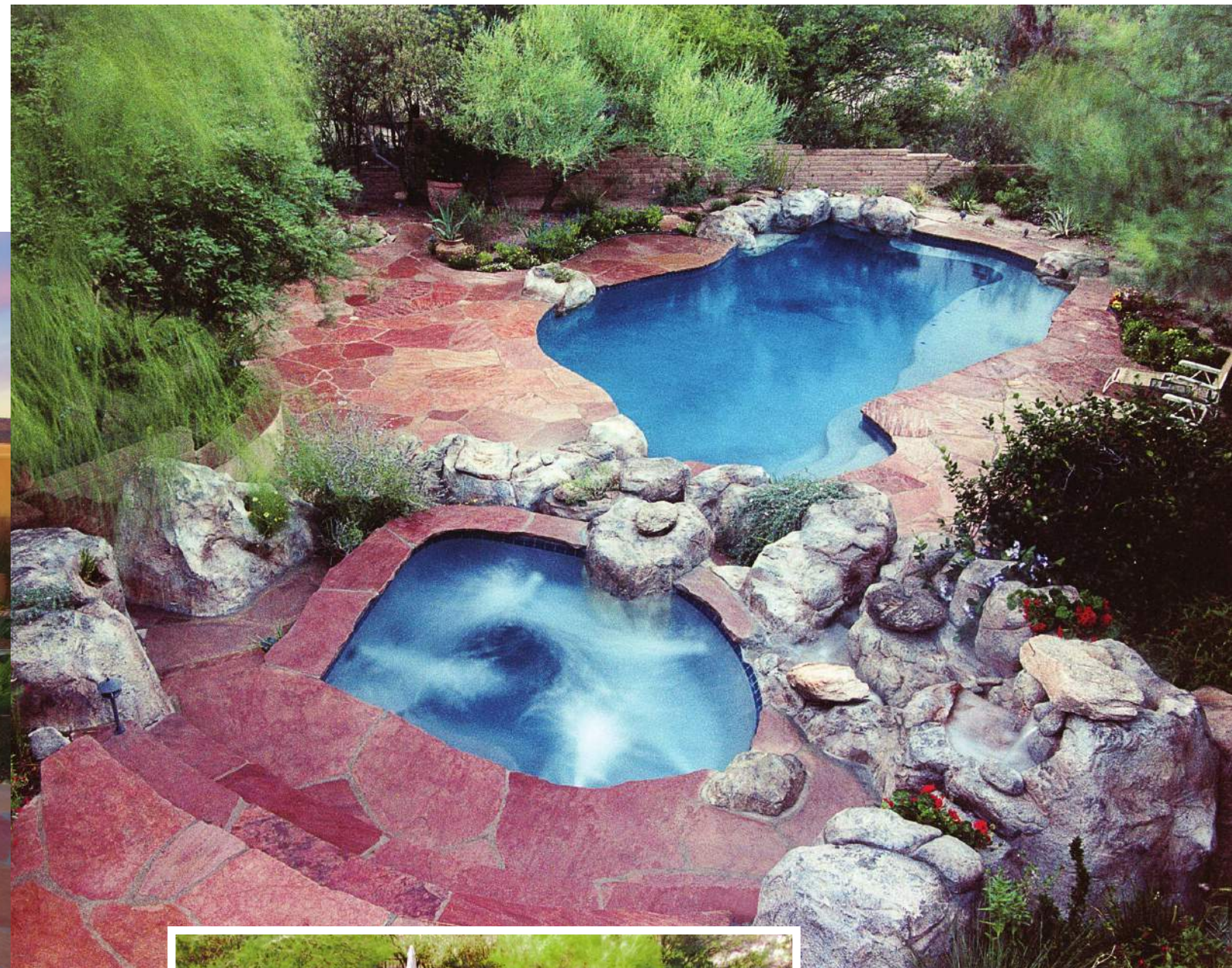
On Deck: Pools, Refreshed

Don't let the sun set before you've planned your new pool. Here are some photos to inspire you.

The original spa, pool tile and interior finish of the pool were removed. The existing flagstone decking was removed to allow installation of an automatic pool cover. Custom flagstone lids cover the new mechanisms. An acrylic spa was added behind a new four-foot sheer decent style water feature. Pebble Tec interior and natural stone waterline tile completed the project. Project by Patio Pools & Spas.

A five-foot retaining wall and hedgerow separated the 1970s angular pool from the house's porch. A large area of the wall was removed for the new spa and wider staircase. The spa zone is 18 inches below the porch to break up the elevation change. The spa features five seats to fit each family member's height and jet levels along with a lay-down bench.
